SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING HELD 11 JULY 2014

Present : Councillor John Shackleton (in the Chair) and Councillors Susan Bosomworth, John Casey, Diane Glanvill, John Haxby, John Thurston, Richard Walker, Kevin Wilkie, Tony Willis and Marion Wright.
