133/18	<p>Apologies The following apologies were received :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cllr S Bosomworth - personal • Cllr R Horley – illness <p>RESOLVED: Council resolved to note the apologies and accept the reasons given for absence.</p>
134/18	<p>Declarations of interest No declarations of interest in accordance with the requirements of the Localism Act 2011 were made.</p>
135/18	<p>Public participation time Members of the public commented on the trees near the Church obscuring the lights; a street on the Town Map was shown as one way but is in fact two-way and there were no films of previous meetings on the website at the present time. The Town Clerk stated that the website was being updated at the present time and these should be available shortly.</p>



136/18	North Yorkshire Police Report Members had previously been circulated with a copy of their Report and PCSO Ridley introduced herself as being new to the area. Cllr Shackleton was pleased to note that crime figures were down once again. PCSO Ridley stated that St Oswald's Church area was being patrolled more often after recent incidents. Cllr Roderick commented on the one-way system of West Road stating that vehicles were driving the wrong way, it was pointed out that the builders at the nearby school had created an entrance off Scarborough Road therefore their vehicles should not now be using West Road. Cllr Walker commented on the practice of vehicles parking and blocking the footpath adjacent to the Corner Café on Belle Vue Street.
137/18	Borough and County Councillor Reports a) Scarborough Borough Councillor's Reports Boro Cllr Cross verbally reported that he was still pursuing the problems of the bins being left out on the back of Hope Street. The work at Flat Cliffs, Primrose Valley had been completed however an alternative road was being investigated and Cllr Houlden-Banks and interested parties were to have a meeting in the near future. Cllr Wright commented on the incident which occurred the previous Sunday when a boat being pulled by rope up to Coble Landing slipped sideways and hit another boat. This incident was reported to Scarborough Borough Council the following morning who were to investigate. Members also commented on the growing problem of the bottom half of Coble Landing and parts of the Beach being used as a car park. Cllr Haxby commented that the Borough Council had not posted the results of the bathing water testing for 2018 which they were under a legal obligation to do. Boro Cllr Cross was to take this matter up. b) North Yorkshire County Councillor's Report Cty Cllr Swiers verbally reported that a compromise had been reached with the owner of the property on the junction of Wharfedale/Muston Road whereby approximately 50% of the hedge/shrubs would be removed and the remainder cut back; it had been suggested that the keep clear markings on Melville Terrace be replaced with double yellow lines however a review of parking was to be pushed for in Filey; Cold Calling – Trading Standards should be contacted regarding any problems. Cllr Meek commented that with regard to the footpaths on Silverwood Avenue, the new edging stones did not line up. Cllr Houlden-Banks requested a clear mandate on displaying items on footpaths. Members commented that the area around Chapel Corner was a major problem in respect of the junction with West Avenue and had previously requested bollards with directional arrows on or a barrier down the centre and that some of the Environmental Budget monies be used to



	<p>endeavour to solve the issues in this area.</p> <p>Cllr Haxby commented on the proliferation of Blue Dolphin signs which had been erected, especially on roundabouts etc, as these had been made to look like official County Council signage and suggested that they needed investigation.</p> <p>Further items raised by members were a public footpath which was overgrown near the Golf Club and parking on grassed area between Church Cliff Farm and Country Park. Members also raised other parking problems especially in Murray Street together with blocked gutters in West Road.</p>
138/18	<p>Town Clerk and RFO Report</p> <p>Members had been circulated with a copy of the report which contained information that a commemorative statue was to be located in the Memorial Gardens to commemorate the end of World War 1; estimated costs for future work on Queen Street garden to make the area safe; Evac chair training; future meetings, upcoming local meetings and events and the mayoral engagements.</p>

142/18	<p>Ward Election Status</p> <p>Cllr Roderick was welcomed to the meeting as the new Town Councillor.</p> <p>A full list of appointments to committees and representation on external bodies which had been made at the Annual Meeting had been circulated and some vacancies were noted. Cllr Roderick was requested to consider whether she could fill some of these vacancies. Cllr Houlden-Banks indicated that she would like to take up the vacancy on the Filey & District Tourism Association.</p> <p>Councillor Anthony proposed, seconded by Councillor Wright that the Council approve the above request by Cllr Houlden-Banks.</p> <p>RESOLVED: Council supported the above request by Cllr Houlden-Banks to be a Town Council representative on the Filey & District Tourism Association.</p> <p>At this point Cllr Haxby read out a statement in which he wished it to be known that he was not responsible for supplying any information to the North Yorkshire Enquirer regarding the new Councillor prior to the recent by-election. Cllr Roderick objected to his use of the word 'sordid' and requested that he withdraw this word from his statement, but he declined.</p> <p>Standing Order 3e was suspended at this point to permit a member of the public to speak.</p> <p>The member of public confirmed that Cllr Haxby was not the person responsible for passing any information to the North Yorkshire Enquirer.</p> <p>Standing Order 3e was re-instated at this point.</p>
143/18	<p>Filey's Recent Accolades</p> <p>Members were informed of the following recent accolades and to consider how best to use these when promoting the Town.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Voted best Beach in Great Britain by a Sunday broadsheet• Named 3rd place as one of the country's top stacation venues by a large tourism agency.• Awarded Green Flag status in July 2018 for Filey's outstanding parks and open spaces. <p>Members suggested that Welcome to Yorkshire be requested to help promote the town together with other organisations such as Chamber of Trade and Filey Tourism Association with a combined 'Working Party' on promotion for 'all' organisations. The information should also be included on the website and within the Town Guide. The Town Clerk confirmed that the Town Council was a member of Welcome to Yorkshire</p>
